





## FOUR PORTS, ONE PORT AUTHORITY

Genoa, Pra', Savona and Vado Ligure, the ports of the Western Ligurian Sea - grouped together as the Ports of Genoa - rank as Italy's pre-eminent port range in terms of total throughput, multi-commodity diversification and economic output.

Since 2017 the ports have been governed by a single Port Authority which is committed to offering the highest standards of service to operators and clients alike, improving efficiency by simplifying administrative procedures and setting out terms and conditions of port redevelopment to enhance port competitiveness.

## IN THE HEART OF EUROPE

Strategically located in the northernmost point of the Mediterranean Sea at the heart of Europe, easily accessible overland across fast road and rail connections and by sea across the ultra-large container vessels which can dock in the ports' natural deepwater, the Ports of Genoa are equipped to consolidate their leadership as the premier Mediterranean gateway to the major consumer centres in Europe. The industrial heartland of Europe sits within a 600-km range of the ports: Switzerland, Bavaria, Baden-Wurttemberg, Austria.

## **30 SPECIALISED TERMINALS**

Located across a total surface area of approximately 7 million sqm, 30 specialised terminals handle nearly 70 million tonnes of cargo, catering for all key commodity sectors: container, general cargo, ro/ro and bulk.

Specifically, the Ports of Genoa rank as the leading Mediterranean gateway port for containers, project and heavy-lift cargo, and fruit.



# AN EXTENSIVE LINER SERVICE NETWORK ACROSS THE WORLD

With over 150 deep-sea, short-sea, feeder and ro/ro liner services, the Ports of Genoa are connected to over 500 ports worldwide.

The port basins offer direct access to the open sea, natural deepwater, minimal tidal range, favourable marine conditions: everything is in place to accommodate safely the ultra-large ships of the container, bulk and passenger handling sectors.

#### **EFFICIENT LAND-SEA CONNECTIONS**

The Ports of Genoa benefit from a strategic position with easy access to/from the major inland routes, both by road across the international motorway network and by rail to major industrial destinations, including direct on-terminal connections along the Rhine-Alpine Corridor, with capacity upgrades due to be completed soon. In addition, the Port Authority is committed to an intensive use and expansion of its Port Community System to ensure the smooth exchange of electronic documents, amongst all parties concerned in the logistics supply chain, to reduce dwelling and transit times in the ports.

#### ONE OF THE MED'S TOP PASSENGER PORTS

The ports also rank amongst the Mediterranean's leading passenger hubs: homeport to the world's major cruise liners, transit ports featuring a wide selection of attractive destinations along the glamorous Italian Riviera, state-of-the-art ferry terminals with scheduled services to the major Italian islands, Sardinia and Sicily, to Corsica, Spain, Malta and North Africa. Every year over 4 million passengers choose the Ports of Genoa, Savona and Vado as embarkation points for their holidays.

#### EFFICIENT INTEGRATION WITH THE SUPPLY CHAINS

The Ports of Genoa benefit from a strategic position with easy access to/from the major inland routes, both by road across the international motorway network and by rail to major industrial destinations, including direct on-terminal connections along the Rhine-Alpine Corridor.

Road and railway last mile infrastructures are the subject of an extensive renovation plan aimed at further improving the accessibility of port terminals.

In addition, the Port Authority is boosting the development of digital technologies, to reduce dwelling and transit times in the ports, by developing smart port terminal gate access, mobile apps for truckers (including vehicle pre-notification and booking systems), automated data exchange between all the players of the supply chain (including Customs).

#### COMMITTED TO SUSTAINABILITY


The Ports of Genoa are deeply committed to contributing to the achievement of the UN Sustinable Development Goals. The environmental performance of the port is being improved across a comprehensive investment plan aimed at reducing the carbon footprint of the port cluster. Green projects include the installation of ship-to-shore power connections along all the port quays, the development of smart energy management systems, from renewable energy production to energy storage and distribution to port users, the implementation of green fuel management and filling plants, port and ship waste management improvement, the urban regeneration of the areas between the ports and the towns.



# RAIL SERVICES FOR FREIGHT TO NORTHERN ITALY, SWITZERLAND AND SOUTHERN GERMANY

The Ports of Genoa are strengthening their market positioning on key markets thanks to a wide range of intermodal services set up as primary freight links with the leading inland terminals in Northern Italy, Switzerland and the Baden Wurttemberg area in Southern Germany. Enhanced operational cooperation among port terminals, public railways network agencies, MTO's and road haulage operators has led to the introduction of new container dedicated intermodal products from the Ports of Genoa. Container freight train departures have risen over a hundred per week on the Italian domestic markets, connecting the Milan area and the industrial regions of Lombardy, Emilia-Romagna and Veneto to all main terminals in Genoa, Prà, Savona and Vado Ligure. Ports of Genoa has been consolidating the PSA Prà terminal to/from Basel Frekendorf 3/week container service while the same operator will be inaugurating the new PSA Prà terminal to/from Stuttgart Kornwestheim 2/week rail link, in May, 2023.

This "terminal led" innovative model of business for freight trains, granting total commercial "neutrality" for cargo interests, has proven to be a decisive element for the markets across all Europe. In addition to



this, significant infrastructural improvement works on the last mile rail links in all port basins and the adoption of "state of the art" technologies to optimize shunting and railway operations are on the way, contributing to a significant reduction in direct port accessibility costs for all classes of cargo.

With a seriously upgraded PCS assisted digital customs clearings in Genoa, data show a permanent 5 day transit time advantage for Genoa based shipments compared to northern range alternatives, on a wide range of origins and destinations worldwide. Alp-Transit projects close to completion and the entry into service by 2026 of the all flat and hi-speed hi-capacity rail line to Milan ("Terzo valico") will further consolidate the lines capacity, keep competitive transit times and contribute to shift a greater volume of sea originated cargo onto trains, indeed the "greenest" of all inland logistics solution, being able to contribute to a strong decarbonization of transport, up to 40% of the total Co2 registered emissions.

In 2022 the Ports of Genoa consolidated their role as Italy's pre-eminent port range, reaching their all-time record in container traffic. Total containerised tonnage rose by +3.5%, with gateway box traffic registering an increase of +4.1% compared to 2021, with volumes firmly back to pre-pandemic levels, up +0.6% on 2021 at 2.8 million TEUs.

Positive results across the board: the Ports of Genoa, Savona and Vado-Ligure responded robustly to the uncertainties which have blighted international trade in the latter part of the year and confirmed a +4.2% advance in total cargo throughput to 66,226,597 tons. One of the port's leading commodity segments, conventional general cargo which includes the ro-ro product group, continued along an upward trend, rising to almost 14.6 million tons, +4.9% compared to 2021.

The ferry terminals handled a total of 2,661,442 passengers, a jump of +40.3% on the previous year and an improvement on pre-Covid 2019. The cruise terminals reported a passenger count of 1,571,567, pointing to a rebound in the industry, with a +10% increase in cruise calls compared to 2019, thereby consolidating the Ports of Genoa and Savona's third-post ranking amongst the top Mediterranean cruise hubs.

The growth in container traffic has boosted the port's modal split, up to 16.6% by rail, with a total of 418,695 TEUs freighted by over 10,000 rail cars.





#### PORT OF PRA'

The Port of Pra' was specifically designed to handle container traffic.

With state-of-the-art port facilities and direct on-terminal connections with the national road and rail network, PSA Genova Pra' terminal ranks as the leading maritime gateway to the Northern Italian industrial and consumer centres.



## PSA GENOVA PRA'

**PSA Genova Pra'** is one of the main gateway terminals to Europe in the Mediterranean Sea. Specifically designed to cater for large volumes of box traffic and to accommodate large container vessels, the container terminal is equipped to handle simultaneously three ULCVs, including two 20,000-TEU ships. Modern and sustainable facilities and direct on-terminal road and rail connections have consolidated PSA Genova Pra's position as the first container gateway port in Italy.

PSA Genova Pra' is part of PSA Italy, which operates in Genoa and Venice in the terminals of PSA Genova Pra', PSA SECH and PSA Vecon, with a total of more than 2 million TEUs handled per year and over 1200 people directly employed in Italy.

PSA Italy is a member of PSA International (PSA), a leading port group and trusted partner to cargo stakeholders. With flagship operations in Singapore and Antwerp, PSA's global network encompasses 160 locations in 42 countries around the world.

An automated real-time container tracking system ensuring fast gate clearance; the terminal has the capacity to handle over 2,400 trucks daily, with an overall turnaround time of 30 minutes from gate-in to gate-out. A direct on-terminal highway connection allows fast access to the A26 and A6 Northbound motorways to Milan and Turin as well as the A10 South to central Italy and West to France.

The facility also boasts an on-dock railyard equipped with 4 RMGs, linked with the Italian railway network

PSA directly operates two rail services: Southern Express, the PSA freight service offering 3-weekly connections between the Port of Genoa and Basel in Switzerland and the Stuttgart Express providing 2-weekly connections between the Port of Genova Pra' and Stuttgart in Germany. In addition, PSA Genova Pra' offers the full range of chain supply services, namely warehouses, consolidation and deconsolidation of loads, warehouse inventory services - soon also abroad - special preparations for containers, heat treatments, weighing, sampling, and many other logistic activities. The Terminal is continuously improving its performance thanks both to strong commitment and to the relentless efforts made in the implementation of its Integrated QSE Management System certified by



Certiquality.

#### PORT OF GENOA

The upward trend in box traffic continues in Genoa handled by a range of full-container and multipurpose terminals.

Genoa ranks as Italy's premier multipurpose port: it boasts long-time experience and offers a wide selection of facilities equipped to handle all commodities, from containers to Ro-Ro, from general cargo to project cargo.

In the Genoa- Sampierdarena basin the new open-sea breakwater is under construction, a 1.2 billion euro port infrastructure designed to provide easy access to terminal facilities and a wide turning basin for ultra-large container vessels to manoeuvre in full safety. The new breakwater, a sophisticated feat of engineering, will be 6.2 km long and reach depths of up to 50 meters.

PSA SECH, First privatised container terminal in Italy in 1993, with thirty years of experience, PSA SECH is

It features an automatic access gate, a state-of-the-art border inspection post and it is well equipped for the storage of both dangerous cargo and reefer containers.

equipped to cater for 14,000 TEUs vessels: it is an optimal base as a centre of cargo handling excellence

with onward distribution towards the major Northen Italian logisitc hubs.

The terminal covers a total surface area of 205,000 square meters, featuring a 526-m quay: the ship-to-shore gantry cranes have an outreach of 20 rows and the depth at berth is -15 m alongside the full length of the quay.

**Bettolo - Genoa Mediterranean Gateway** container terminal opened for business in Q4 2020. A Mediterranean pivotal hub for the MSC controlled Terminal Investment Limited (TIL), Calata Bettolo is one of the latest additions of the Swiss carrier world terminals branch. With a total capacity of some half million TEUS and an intense investment programme focused on of semi-automation at the yards, Calata Bettolo traffic volumes in 2022 have grown steadily.

Upon completion of the new Port of Genoa open sea breakwater, Calata Bettolo terminal will be able to cater all classes of ULCS.









**Genoa Port Terminal**, part of the Spinelli Group, handles an annual average of 440,000 TEUs and over 500,000 linear metres of rolling cargo, offering regular services of major shipping lines to/from Africa, Turkey, Israel, North America and South America.

**C. Steinweg - GMT** is located in Genoa as regional office of the Steinweg Group for the Central Med, the Adriatic Coast and North Africa. The company is the leading metal logistics operator in Italy.

**Forest Terminal**, part of the Campostano Group, is dedicated to forest products, handling pulp for paper production, kraft liner board, reels, newsprint and timber.

**Terminal San Giorgio (TSG)**, owned by the Gavio Group, ranks as one of the leading multipurpose terminals in the Port of Genoa and is equipped to handle the full range of key commodities, namely containers,





breakbulk, project cargo, steel products, yachts, ro-ro cargo.

Intermodal Marine Terminal (IMT) is a multipurpose facility, fully equipped to cater for all key commodity sectors: containers, general and rolling cargo, machinery, yachts and project cargo, offering tailor-made services according to customer's specific requirements. The terminal offers direct liner services to the Mediterranean, Red Sea, North Africa, Middle East, West Africa and South East Africa.

Furthermore, the Port of Genoa accommodates a range of terminals specialized in vegetable oils and derivatives, solid bulks, mineral oils, chemical and petrochemical products, in addition to providing ship bunkering services.



#### PORT OF SAVONA

Savona is a multipurpose port, which can meet shipment requirements for every type of breakbulk cargo (forest products and cellulose, iron & steel, cars and heavy equipment, trucks and trailers), handled in multipurpose terminals embracing innovative warehousing facilities and long-standing experience. Specialized terminals have turned Savona into a key element in Northern Italian industrial supply chain, equipped to handle all raw materials and liquid products.




**Savona Terminal Auto**, part of the Grimaldi Group, operates a Ro-Ro terminal for new cars, engineering vehicles and rolling stock. Furthermore, the terminal offers regular Motorways of the Sea services for trucks and trailers to Barcelona and Valencia.

**Savona Terminals** is a multipurpose operator offering handling and storage services for forest products, general cargo, white bulk, iron and steel products and metals.

**Colacem** operates a silo for the storage of bulk grains, oil seeds, by-products and cement, equipped with automated truck/wagon loading systems.

**Monfer** specialises in handling and storage of agribulk, by-products and vegetable oil and is equipped with a railway link for shipments to inland destinations.





**Terminal Alti Fondali** Savona handles hard coals and energy products. The terminal is able to receive the largest bulk carriers, offering an unloading capacity of 2,000 tons/h. Delivery to customers can be carried out by truck or rail. The port storage tanks are also connected by a cable-way to the wide inland storage area where goods may be selected and crushed.

**BuT** Terminal offers handling, storage and packaging services (bags and big-bags) for dry bulk and soft commodities. The port of Savona also boasts specialized facilities suitable for handling and warehousing edible and non-edible vegetable oils (**Depositi Costieri Savona**) and other liquid products, and petroleum products destined for coastal fuel and lube oil refineries (**IP ITALIANA PETROLI**).



#### PORT OF VADO LIGURE

Vado Ligure is one of the main Mediterranean hubs for fruit imports to Europe, thanks to regular lines services to the main areas of crop production (Americas, Africa, Mediterranean Sea) for palletised and containerised cargo. Dedicated storage facilities for fruit, fresh and refrigerated commodities are available directly on-dock and in the port area.


The Vado Ligure basin hosts, since 12 December 2019, Vado Gateway, the first semi-automated container terminal in Italy, with 700 m deep sea berth and an overall yearly capacity of 860,000 TEUs (950 reefer plugs). In September 2022, in the immediate vicinity of the port, the Pacorini group opened one of the world's largest green coffee warehouses; the facility, with 84 cells, capable of storing different qualities of raw material, and a total storage capacity of 27,000 tonnes, represents a key logistics centre for the Italian and international coffee market.



**Vado Gateway** (partnership among Apm Terminals and Cosco) the new Container Terminal, in operation since 12 December 2019, is the first semi-automated terminal in Italy, featuring a fully automated gate and stacking yard. The 700m deep-sea berth, equipped with five 23- rows Ship-to-Shore cranes, with a maximum 65-ton capacity in twin lift configuration and 100 tons 'under hook', can handle the latest Ultra Large Container Vessels (ULCVs).

**Reefer Terminal** is the leading fruit terminal in the West Mediterranean sea (with a yearly average total of 500,000 tons), handling tropical fruit (bananas, pineapples), citrus and counterseasonal produce from the South hemisphere. The terminal can also offer storage and handling services for oversized/project cargo.





Forship manages a Ro-Ro terminal for passengers and cargo, operating regular links to Corsica.

Vado Ligure is also a leading hub in the petroleum traffic flows: the **Sarpom** buoy field located 0.7 miles from the coast can accommodate large tankers for unloading crude oil destined for inland refineries, while the Alkion terminal handles, stores and distributes fuels for the major oil companies and Esso Italiana supplies its local plant with base oils for lubricant manufacturing and distribution.

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
